DISABLED EUROPEAN COMMUNIQUE FOR THE DISABLED

May 12, 2000, COM (2000) 284 final

People with disabilities are considered the most disadvantaged group living in the community and are constantly they face obstacles in all areas of social life. These barriers allow people to more restrictions than obstacles caused by deficiencies.

A clause in the Amsterdam Treaty to combat discrimination against the disabled is essential. Based on this article, the Council of Europe discriminated in 1999 The struggle has prepared a package program. This program provides employment and employment for disabled people. By publishing an EU-wide directive on discrimination in life, preventive It proposes to prepare an action plan for taking measures.

This communiqué reviews the EU policies on people with disabilities. efforts to increase accessibility across Europe. foresees. With this communiqué that focuses on creating a barrier-free Europe for people with disabilities. vocational acquisition, education, vocational training, transportation, domestic market, information society and new technologies A synergy at the European level has been tried to be created in such subjects. Independent movement is a prerequisite for participating in economic and social life, and in cases where this does not happen The disabled individual cannot benefit from the rights granted to him sufficiently. Like e-europe As in the initiatives, the functional developments of the EU technology will play a role in reducing the effects of their limitations and increasing their participation in social life. It is known. Accurate statistical information on the frequency of disability is effective cooperation and Consultancy mechanisms are important tools for this communiqué to take place in practice. Besides the physical barriers, the negative attitude of the society towards the disabled should also be resolved. are among the problems. For all these reasons the Commission from the Council 2003 awareness of the year as the European Year of the Disabled, he wanted it to be created and new policies to be created.

The EU's policies on disability at the international level were to the "Standard Rules Principle Decision for Disabled People on Equality of Opportunity" which he accepted It is based. In this principle decision, employment and social life of individuals with disabilities the acceptance of the society towards the disabled individual plays an important role in their participation. It is indicated. In order to follow these standard rules, the EU Commission "For the Disabled He published a paper titled "Equal Opportunity". Commission member states on this issue expects them to carry out their activities in cooperation. Since 1997 At meetings with the European Parliament, member states and non-governmental organizations, and The Council reports frequently address issues related to the disabled. Europe in 1997 Council prepared annually since the adoption of the Employment Strategy The guidelines include issues related to disability. Member countries will prepare Including groups with disabilities in National Action Plans for Employment they should increase and strive to improve their business skills.

On February 4, 2000, a communiqué on business strategies was published in the information society. Europe Employment of people with disabilities in this paper supporting the Employment Strategy and the e-Europe initiative

and the user-friendly tools of the manufacturers in the information society. are asked to improve.

Member countries employment from the European Social Fund between 1994-99 received financial support to increase its opportunities. Work experience, wage support, protected many activities in the fields of establishing a business, establishing a business and establishing a cooperative. supported in scope. For the 2000-2006 process, especially disabled people from member countries supporting initiatives to create employability and equal opportunities It is expected.

Finding employment for some disabled people with special difficulties within the scope of "Employment Community Initiatives" and It is supported to protect its business. One of the four dimensions of this Initiative HORIZON in the vocational education of people with disabilities who have cerebral palsy and mental problems, and strives to ensure positive changes in employment policies. There are 1700 projects supported under HORIZON.

At the request of the Commission, social partners are good examples of the employment of people with disabilities. prepared a compilation that brought it together and Europe gathered in Vienna in December 1998. He submitted to the Council. In addition, on 19 May 1999, the employment of disabled people A common declaration was adopted. Sample applications code accepted in 1998 This code has been clarified to the policies of the European Institutions regarding the employment of disabled people. earned.

Socrates, Leonardo da Vinci, Health Promotion, Daphne, Prince, Phare and Tacis etc. programs projects for the needs of the disabled are supported through the project. Intergovernmental in Amsterdam, in addition to Article 13 of the Community treaty Combating discrimination against the disabled with the declaration numbered 22 adopted at the conference Efforts on the subject were brought forward. In this declaration, the European Community institutions, members disabled countries in the process of bringing their legal regulations closer to the European Union to take into account their needs and to combat discrimination and equality of opportunity. wants them to develop standards that increase integration in their fields.

This communiqué not only brings together specific goals and measures, but In line with the principle of combating discrimination and integrative approach, reveals the perspective. This communiqué is also used as a policy base by the member states. available.

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SECTION 3 I. Roadmap for the Community to Add More Added Value

3.1. Towards Independent Life as a Citizen

In modern societies, the individual is independently to participate in social and economic life. If it cannot act, it cannot be thought that the individual can fully participate in society.

Especially individuals who have limitations in acting independently, social, cultural, unlike other people who have less participation in economic and political life Remains. Especially to integrate people with disabilities into society as much as possible To increase freedom of movement by increasing the possibilities of public transportation, social exclusion will greatly reduce.

The European Union has long been aware of the importance of this issue. The European Union in 1993 The Commission has a chance to use the transportation resources of disabled people with mobility restrictions. has adopted the "Community Action Plan on Accessible Transport" in order to increase it. This coordinating plan research projects, communicating on information programs, transportation sub a series on setting technical standards applicable to the structure and means of transportation It consists of a community measure.

Recently, the Commission aimed at transport vehicles carrying more than eight passengers. Directive that includes measures to increase the accessibility of individuals with disabilities accepted. Draft Directive on the vehicles to be used in urban passenger transport systems offers technical recipes for accessibility. At the same time Intercity passenger It also contains recommendations for transport systems.

European Union efforts to increase the accessibility of individuals with disabilities are presented below takes place in the fields.

- To increase the level of service; disabled in all transportation systems and public transportation vehicles to prepare guidebooks for the necessary arrangements for individuals,

There is a statement regarding the increase.
- Integration studies in advanced research; in the fifth framework research program accessibility in research and studies related to transportation infrastructure and transportation systems coverage is foreseen.
- The Community will establish the European Local Transport Information Service (ELTIS) and establish the International Collective Good in cooperation with the Transport Association (UITP) and local and regional POLIS network tried to provide support and dissemination of application examples.

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Increasing Accessibility: Closing Gaps Between Sectors

Unless the entire transportation system is thoroughly reviewed for accessibility, Increasing the accessibility of means of transport will not be sufficient. With limited mobility accessible buses, unless individuals have access to bus stops and train stations; and Making trains will not be very meaningful. Access to the building, access to public areas and transportation A framework should be identified to cover such gaps between accessing systems.

Industry, information society, social cohesion, regional development, environment at European Union level, in policy areas related to transportation, social policy, workplace health and safety. all events have an impact on accessibility. Employer's workplace of disabled employee such as the 89/391 / EEC Framework Directive prepared to make it suitable for use some EU legal regulations address issues related to mobility. In the Commission's view, coordination between the European Union policy areas It should increase accessibility. By doing so, it will increase the quality of business life, will ensure the safety of its customer and improve the effectiveness of the European Industry. In fact, policies to increase the employment of individuals with disabilities the opportunity to fully realize unless effective measures for accessibility are taken can not find.

In addition, creating a safe and suitable work environment fully supports the work capacity of the disabled individual. It is important in terms of being able to use it and maintain its existence in a competitive environment. Accessibility stands out in some of the services provided to the public. This is especially tourism it provides surplus returns for the organization that provides service in the industry because these organizations It is preferred for elderly people with disabilities and mobility impairments.

- To ensure universal accessibility in the fifth framework program It is stated that the roads should be investigated.

3.3. Presenting the Information Society to Everyone's Benefit

Access to information has also gained importance in the information society. Especially knowledge and advances in communication technology opportunities for people It eliminates many obstacles. However, individuals with disabilities despite this, it may encounter various obstacles in this area.

In this context, the European Union is responsible for everyone, including people with disabilities, from the information society. has initiated various studies to take advantage of it. This Commission's "Social and Labor Market Dimension of the information Society People First-Next Step " technology's participation in these processes to increase integration and employment of disabled people It aims at promoting and disseminating it.

Other relevant initiatives are included in the Commission's directive 98/10 / EC. vowel from the member states in terms of universal telecommunications in telephone and competition environment Taking measures to ensure the accessibility of individuals with disabilities It is desirable. At the meeting of the Council and the European Parliament of 9 March 1999 Radio and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Directive Some class equipment to the Commission It gives the authority to adapt such tools to the shape that disabled people can use.

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Participation in the information society and its independent life in the Fifth RTD Framework Program support and adaptive systems for supporting services and removing environmental barriers it is required to investigate. The European Commission Joint Research Center is also actively It tries to develop new technologies for the use of disabled people.

On 8 December 1999 the European Commission launched the "e-Europe: Information for All" initiative. This initiative will ensure that everyone in Europe has access to information in the information society. studies started. Accordingly, ten fields of activity were identified, one of these fields of activity is also aimed at providing disabled people with access to information. To increase the access of disabled people to information The aims determined for this are:

- Reviewing all legal regulations and standards related to the information society reassessment in terms of accessibility;
- The Commission's disability in public supply systems on information and communication matters a communiqué describing how to take into account the needs of individuals Publishing;
- The European Union Institutions and the Member States' existing "Web Accessibility Initiative" increase the use of the information provided to the public on the web
 It should also be prepared in accordance with the accessibility of the disabled.

 public and private sector cooperation should be encouraged to make it widespread;
- Curriculum where designers and engineers will be trained on accessibility should be prepared and interaction between authorized institutions should be initiated.

3.4. What Technology Makes Possible: Support Technology Market

Applying the design principle for everyone in the technology, service and product industry The result of making production suitable for a wide range of users including disabled people It raises. However, producing a wider range is suitable for all disabled individuals. it does not mean that the product can be made. This type of users' access to technology the most guaranteed way to ensure production or product according to their specific needs to adapt for the disabled person to use. This type of adapted or custom made technologies are called support technology.

Although these products have a very large market, but with the increase in the population, this

it is thought that the market will grow even more. Elderly with disabilities and mobility restrictions people's support technology products only cost 326 billion ECU in 1990. Special Judging by the support technology market, this amount is now 10 billion euros annually and this amount it continues with an annual increase of 10-20%. Looking at the European industry, these products produced by very small and medium-sized industrial entrepreneurs and generally very large it appears that they do not have a product catalog and have limited resources. Increasing the interest of the European industry on this issue and the market at the European Union level As a result of its creation, reasonable priced products and services may emerge. Fifth program within the framework of small and medium-sized industrial entrepreneurs producing in this direction It is envisaged to be supported.

- Prerequisite for the collection and dissemination of information to be presented to users and the market is to provide information, advice and guidance. Other databases from Handynet and Commission on national experience as a result of information gathering projects support technologies improve the knowledge and coordination between information services. to increase the opportunities that can be provided for disabled people in the widespread use process. aims.
- The availability of affordable support technology products and their affordable prices It is also important for individuals to benefit from the opportunities equally. Member countries is obliged to determine the provisions on support equipment. With this together, our link to the elimination of social, physical and political barriers making it easier for people with disabilities and older people to be in a more disabled environment. will provide the opportunity to live. This is one of the goals the EU is trying to achieve. It is one.

3.5. Protection of Rights of Disabled Consumers

In the past, especially companies whose products were used by a large part of the population considered the needs of individuals with disabilities. However, companies are eligible products that meet the needs of individuals with disabilities when management techniques are applied by creating a new market and creating a price balance. started to adopt. This trend has also started to affect European consumer policy, The rights of disabled consumers are tried to be secured together with all consumers. Providing financial support to projects or informing organizations so far with this approach developed in the form. One of the works carried out in this direction is the Need of Private Users. is to develop the criteria. In the implementation of the Design Principle for All, products These criteria can also be used in the comparative test and protocols to be prepared. In the context of consumer protection, in Directive 95/46 / EC (Official Gazette 281, 23.11.1995) It also safeguards the protection of personal information about disability.

These positive developments should strengthen with the following activities:

Within the framework of the Consumer Policies Action Plan prepared for the new millennium, the Commission,

especially for justice, financial services and product security It should take into account that it is given an ambiguous place. In the field of consumer safety, the Commission is

to pay particular attention to the safety and use of disabled people has brought imperative.

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• In new legal regulations regarding electronic communication infrastructure and related services Targets should be set for the needs of disabled consumers.

4. SECTION II. POLICY TOOLS FOR THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE COMMUNITY

"The inadequacy of disability related information, ignorance and prejudice, it prevents the formation of policies. The differences of the disabled in themselves, different conditions, types of disability and degree of disability, with different disabilities encounters make the solution of this problem more difficult. Any precaution When acquiring a strong knowledge, coordination and consultancy mechanisms are indispensable is important.

4.1. Interpretation of Numbers and Determining Needs

Independently in the home, work and social life of people with disabilities the Commission and policy makers will plan to ensure their the measures they will design will provide reliable statistics and demographic data on disabled people. It depends.

In 1992/1993, EUROSTAT on the socio-economic status and qualifications of the disabled published a comprehensive document containing various statistics. A multi-purpose research European Community Household Panel, obtaining comparable statistics across Europe has been carried out by the European Statistical System since 1994.

The Commission aims to develop appropriate statistical information with the following activities:

- Health, social protection, health and safety at work, employment and education data collection. In addition, the Commission dated September 8, 1999 and numbered 1924/1999. According to the Directive, a report on the employment of disabled people in the European Labor Survey Studies on putting modules will be completed in 2002. On disability member in terms of definitions and data collection methods comparable cooperation will be made between countries. Data if needed Efforts will be made to eliminate incompatibilities.
- Health Monitoring Program, health indicators and data in the European Union It aims to develop a framework to be comparable. This indicators are different disability in terms of daily life, social life and work skills will provide a better understanding of their types and grades.
- Fifth RTD framework Program (1998-2002) especially quality of life and life "Research on aging populations and disabled people" to the development of knowledge about disability through its activities will contribute.
- These programs are aimed especially at the social and physical environment of disabled people (e.g. rehabilitation and support technologies), effective and adequate health and social improving the quality of life and independence of care services aims.

4.2. Designing Integrated European Union Programs

The Commission aims to create open and usable programs for all European Union citizens. aims. When designing a program regardless of the subject in the European Union

It will be made accessible to all citizens, including individuals with disabilities. In cases where the access of individuals with disabilities may be restricted, special precautions can be taken and disabled. reduction of limitations arising from the barriers of individuals as much as possible It is aimed.

The Commission will ensure the participation of people with disabilities in general programs. Opportunity for this purpose in order to meet the special needs of the disabled in order to ensure equality it will also include special measures. The cost of these special measures is that the community's budget allows process will be considered.

4.3. Sampling

In order to create barrier-free services, the EU Commission will set an example will continue to support applications.

a) Employment

Very few representations of individuals with disabilities in the labor market, especially in public services It is. The Commission, together with other EU institutions, said in 1998, "Employment of the Disabled Sample Application Principles". These principles are based on business exams and adaptation procedures for disabled candidates, when it comes to disabled employment vocational training for these individuals focuses on workplace arrangements.

In this framework, the Commission will increase the employment of disabled people in European Public Services. will take the necessary measures in order to. Organization of exams, career development, administrative support and offices designed for the disabled are among the topics to be evaluated in this context. It is also decided to determine the appropriate professions for the disabled.

Knowledge and sensitivity of the staff working in the commission institutions and organizations about disability will encourage them to go through enhancing training. Discrimination against the disabled in this education There will also be information and information sections about the disabled.

b) Accessibility

Within the framework of the principles stated above, the Commission strategies on accessibility It will improve. In addition, in the reorganization of existing buildings, new buildings National standards will be ensured in its construction.

c) Information and Communication

Citizens with disabilities in Europe

has equal rights. Failure to provide information in appropriate formats enables people with disabilities to access information. hampers. The Commission should involve more people in terms of access to information and it uses the internet to reduce the cost of accessing information. because of In this way, the information provided in formats suitable for the disabled will enable the disabled to access the information. and it will make it easier. However, the availability of documents on the Internet can be accessed alone

It does not provide. In terms of access with which operating system language and documents are written is important.

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Differences in the needs of people with disabilities to ensure that communication is holistic and therefore effective It must be taken into attention. Disability difficulties in accessing information presented in standard formats live. Alternative for individuals with affective and cognitive difficulties in accessing information formats are required.

In addition to the points mentioned in the third section, the Commission It will perform.

- The Official Journal of the European Community (OJL) is a will develop and implement a standard to ensure access. Same the creation of materials in alternative formats and across Europe will support its dissemination through the Publishers Forum.
- The Commission amended its principles on accessibility to Commission documents. increasingly alternative to information and publications on policies, programs and services. will be published in formats.

d) Integration in European Schools in European Schools

Integration of Education Ministers and Council children with disabilities into inclusion schools has made various recommendations and policy decisions. These initiatives state at the European level carried out in schools. Especially the European School Administrator's Board's education in 1995 established a support committee and through this board at all levels of European schools It aimed to ensure the inclusion of disabled people.

4.4 Counseling Services for the Disabled

Life experiences affect and prevent them from accessing services to disabled people. quickly grasp policies and practices and find solutions to the problems they face gained the skill. The Commission, the majority of the ideas in this communiqué are disabled, It emerged as a result of a dialogue with experts and associations in the field of disability. The Commission is one of the non-governmental organizations for the disabled when implementing Community initiatives. will receive counseling.

Capacity of the disabled to increase their contribution in policy and program development It will be strengthened. The Commission is responsible for organizations related to the disabled, other non-governmental organizations. it will increase collaboration and promote information sharing.

4.5 Strengthening Coordination of Commission Services

In terms of the coordination of policies on disabilities in the relevant areas of the Commission, All the General Directorates related to the important mechanism "Interservice group on disability" has an active contribution within the group and this group has a sensitivity in the field of disability. It makes a very effective effort in terms of development and provides cross-sectoral cooperation.

Disability interservice group sharing information in the relevant activities of all policy areas to meet regularly to determine requirements and contribute will continue.

Alternative information on disability issues under the Interservice group Commission services will develop forms of presentation.

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Within the context of commission services, information on European programs and initiatives It aims to prepare a guide to support disabled people who want to reach.

This communiqué is for the integration of the disabled in the enlarged EU economy and society. constitutes the framework for future EU initiatives. Three in the foreseen approach the operational goal stands out:

- Implementation of the "Equal Treatment in Employment Directive" (2000/78 / EC)
- · Inclusion of disability dimension in relevant Community policies
- Improving "Accessibility for All"

This communiqué sets out an Action Plan for the process until 2010.

The purpose of the action plan is to include disability issues in the relevant Community policies and Concrete measures are taken in certain areas to ensure the integration of disabled people. To ensure the inclusion of disability issues in Community policies, the Commission has an annual report on the general situation of people with disabilities in enlarged Europe It will be published. The report will also include developments in member countries. Commission, While producing policies in order to produce permanent solutions in the economy and social area, will encourage the parties to be involved in this process.

Employment is of key importance for social integration. Therefore, EU Disabled The first phase of the Action Plan (2004-2005) will promote the employment of people with disabilities will emphasize the issue of creating the necessary conditions. In this process, enlarged Europe it will be ensured that the labor market is more accessible. Accordingly, the Action Plan its first phase reveals the four concrete priorities:

- · Having a job, staying at work and fighting discrimination,
- Life for increasing employment opportunities, adaptation, personal development and active citizenship learning all along,
- Developing and using new technologies to empower the disabled so that increasing employment opportunities,
- Public spaces for reaching workplaces, integration with the economy and society accessibility.

(7) Since the Community has specific actions against gender discrimination, the Program Apart from discrimination, it should deal with all areas of discrimination. In different fields discrimination can have similar characteristics and can be fought similarly. discrimination The experience gained in the fight can also be used on other platforms. However, for this The peculiarities of discrimination in different forms make it suitable for the situation. It should be brought. Therefore, the special needs of people with disabilities should be taken into consideration in terms of accessibility.

(8) Participation in the program is open to all public and / or private bodies, organizations that fight discrimination. should be. Likewise, the experience and skills of local and national civil organizations should be kept in mind.

(9) Many non-governmental organizations in Europe on combating discrimination he has experience through people who have been discriminated against. a) Giving information about the phenomenon of discrimination and policies and practices in this regard developing an understanding of discrimination by assessing its effectiveness;

 b) Different discrimination to prevent discrimination and to effectively draw attention to discrimination especially considering the organizations' specific characters strengthening action tools and supporting information exchange and good practice; and Networking at European level;

c) Anti-discrimination practices, including awareness-raising campaigns. dissemination.

ARTICLE 3

Community Actions

1. In order to achieve the objectives in Article 2, the following actions are transnational It must be performed:

a) Analysis of discrimination factors and legal regulations against discrimination and evaluating the effectiveness of applications;

b) Transnational cooperation and prevention of discrimination at European level and combating discrimination expanding the network among partners, including non-governmental organizations;

c) Emphasizing the European dimension in combating discrimination and reporting the results of the program Raising awareness through publications, campaigns and events.

This park, which allows disabled people to park in the area closest to their destination local and regional authorities authorized to issue their cards to the Committee of the Regions counseling should be provided.

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In accordance with the Principle of Entitlement Substitution, all member countries of the parking card for the disabled Independent movement of people with disabilities by carrying out activities for their recognition by should be supported.

Appropriate measures should be taken, including the provision of relevant support services; National, public authorities, private organizations, cultural and sports organizations at regional and local levels; and specialization / citizenship associations, non-governmental organizations of individuals with disabilities, media, academic all other stakeholders operating in the fields of society and culture, sports, tourism and entertainment, to make these activities accessible to people with disabilities and to these activities national, regional and local in order to ensure full and equal participation of individuals with disabilities be encouraged to prepare strategy and action plans.

Preparation of legal and policy infrastructures and culture, sports, tourism and entertainment in the process of taking concrete measures to ensure the accessibility of their activities Effective and ongoing negotiations with people with disabilities and their representative organizations should be made, The negotiation process enables effective and meaningful participation of individuals with disabilities in these activities. should be regarded as a basic prerequisite for its provision.

In the initial phase of all projects; culture, sports, tourism and entertainment areas, programs, services, facilities, other relevant information, including new technologies information and communication technologies, especially universal design / design for all to ensure that people with disabilities are accessible through the implementation of their principles

adequate planning should be done, such planning should be at a very low additional cost or not at all. It is a very effective tool in terms of providing costless access and social integration and it contributes significantly to the optimization of expenses.

Universal design / to the general public through the implementation of design principles for all open all new culture, sports, tourism and entertainment services and facilities to disabled individuals. be fully accessible; to ensure the full and effective participation of individuals with disabilities environmental purposes in all existing goods, services, products, facilities and services in these areas, All barriers to architecture, information and communication should be identified and gradually eliminated.

Restriction of access to cultural, sports, tourism and entertainment activities on the basis of disability Effective by creating legal arrangements to ensure that it is evaluated as discrimination

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service providers operating in these areas (both public and and private sector), full and equal to ensure accessibility and reasonable accessibility. should be made liable for providing harmonization measures.

Public procurement procedures, incentives and aids for culture, sports, tourism and entertainment of individuals with disabilities are effective in promoting and supporting their access to and full participation in their activities. Appropriate measures should be taken to become a vehicle.

Appropriate measures should be taken to ensure that it shows.
